Complex conveyancing developments

In this session Tony Cahill will discuss a number of dilemmas highlighted by recent judicial pronouncements and legislative and regulatory reforms. The topics covered will include the distinction between put and call options and conditional contracts, and part deposits compared to penalties. Tony will consider what it means to be ready, willing and able to issue a Notice to Complete, as well as the timing and extent of purchase due diligence.
