Remedies in commercial disputes

With reference to recent cases, this session will address complex issues that may arise in the identification and quantification of remedies in commercial disputes. Issues to be addressed include: potential pitfalls for plaintiffs in cases where liability and quantum are determined separately; the several liability of defaulting fiduciaries and third-party assistants or recipients; elections to be made between equitable compensation and an account of profits; and a plaintiff's ability to make different elections between those two remedies as against a defaulting fiduciary and as against a knowing assistant or knowing recipient.
