Inter vivos and testamentary trusts in estate planning and administration

In this session, Raoul Wilson SC will consider both inter vivos and testamentary trusts from a probate litigator's perspective. The session will cover estate objectives, administration considerations and the susceptibility of inter vivos and testamentary trusts to attack in probate and equity cases.

Raoul Wilson SC was appointed a Senior Counsel in 2013.
